Since its founding on October 25, 1894, St. Mary School has consistently provided a strong Catholic faith-based academic education for the students in the local community. We are currently offering education from 4K through to 8th grade. Each of our teachers follows the Wisconsin state standards and incorporates the Catholic faith in all subject areas. The small class sizes enable teachers to work closely with students while identifying their strengths and weaknesses. Collaboration between parents and teachers plays a key role in fulfilling the educational needs of each student.

St. Mary School develops children spiritually, academically, and emotionally through a nurturing school environment.

St. Mary School served a much larger Catholic community in the past and had up to 35 children in each classroom and the school provided education in grades 1 - 8.

In recent years, 5K and 4K were added to our curriculum and we now serve an average of 10 children per classroom, providing a relatively intimate setting for the children under our care.

St. Mary School receives the majority of its financial aid from the parishioners of St Mary Help of Christians Parish, Colby. Additional support is provided by the Alumni of our school, the Christian Home and School Association, the Monsignor Malik Education Fund, the Adopt-A-Student program and a variety of other sources.

Since 2018, St. Mary School joined the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) which is offered by the WI Department of Public Instruction. The children who are entered into the WPCP receive their instruction at St. Mary School with no cost to their parents.
